Civilizations all need things like a steady food and water source, shelter, and clothing (basic human needs). To be considered "civilized," though, there are also certain structures in place.

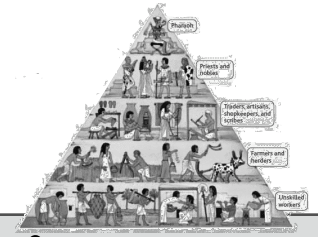
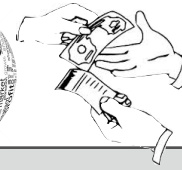
One way to study civilizations is by looking at the GRAPES of that civilization.
